OFFICIAL OPENING OF ÉCOLE ALEXANDRE-TACHÉ AND ÉCOLE JOSEPH-MOREAU

EDMONTON, April 15, 2010 - The Conseil scolaire Centre-Nord is very proud to announce the official opening of two new francophone high schools : École Alexandre-Taché (St. Albert) and École Joseph-Moreau (Edmonton). Several dignitaries have already confirmed their presence : Most Rev. Archbishop Richard Smith, Honourable Hector Goudreau and Honourable Dave Hancock (at Joseph-Moreau only).

The official opening of **École Alexandre-Taché will be held Wednesday April 21 at 7 p.m.** The school is located at 9B, St. Vital Avenue in St. Albert. Over 80 students are presently enrolled in grades 7 to 10. Next year, the school will offer grade 11 and in 2011, grade 12. The school is a result of an agreement between the Conseil scolaire Centre-Nord, Covenant Health and Greater St. Albert Catholic Regional District.

The official opening of **École Joseph-Moreau will be held Tuesday April 27 at 7 p.m.** The school is located at 9750- 74 Avenue (formerly Ritchie Junior HS) in Edmonton. Students from grades 7 to 9 were transferred from École Maurice-Lavallée to École Joseph-Moreau because of increasingly limited space at the Maurice-Lavallée. This year, 250 junior high students are enrolled at École Joseph-Moreau.
