"Their pride and their determination serve as models for all those who embark on this journey of community development and this deserves to be recognized." he concludes.

About École Claudette-et-Denis-Tardif

École Claudette-et-Denis-Tardif is a kindergarten to grade 6 public Francophone school with 87 students currently enrolled and is growing. The school has chosen a peacock as its logo. First, this proud animal symbolizes the nature and fauna that are found within the school zone. Second, the body and wings of the peacock form a *fleur-de-lys* as a reminder that Francophone education strengthens a student's cultural and linguistic identity. Finally, the bird's bright colours, rounded lines and stance reflect the dynamism of the school and its community.

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
